Lance's Coaching Corner

Cricket Tips #1:

Batting Stance

- Ensure that you are basically side-on to the bowler. This decreases the time you need in order to get your feet in a good position to hit the ball.
- Your feet are shoulder width or a little more than shoulder width apart. This ensures that you are balanced at the crease, your weight is evenly distributed and you are in a stable position.
- In most circumstances the bat should be placed behind the back foot. Some professionals decide to put the bat in between their feet, but I guess it feels comfortable.
- The most important aspect is to ALWAYS watch the ball. By watching the ball before the bowler has let go of it enables you to concentrate for a longer period of time on the ball.
