## MacGregor Cricket Club Re-energised

After 10 years as president of MacGregor Cricket Club, David Rieck resigned at their recent Annual General Meeting. He urged all the members of MacGregor to offer their support to the new executive of Col Steinke (president), Greg Hart (vice-president), Greg Bartlett (treasurer) and Nicola Baker (secretary) to ensure the continued development and growth of MacGregor Cricket. The meeting also made the welcome decision to add Russell Waugh (registrar) to their executive.

The new executive has had a flying start in the new summer season with the Warehouse seniors recommencing on 20<sup>th</sup> September, in2CRICKET on 3<sup>rd</sup> October and junior matches on 10<sup>th</sup> October. All members will have to work hard to repeat the successes of last season with 8 junior Metro South West, 5 Warehouse premierships, and Warehouse Club Champions for the second year running.

All members are looking forward to the completion of the new clubhouse and pavilion only weeks away. Courage Homes has been constructing the 2 new buildings. Because of the generosity of Michael Jones (the general manager of Courage), their suppliers & sub-contractors, Courage proposed to build a shed adjacent to the MacGregor's western nets AND a pavilion adjacent to their bottom oval. That is ½ million dollars worth of buildings for about half their real construction costs! The buildings are being funded by a \$128k Minor Facilities Grant from Qld Sport & Recreation, \$20k from Councillor Graham Quirk's MacGregor Ward Fund, \$15k from Sunnybank Community & Sports Club, a \$10k loan from Qld Junior Cricket, and club funds. Graham Quirk has also contributed \$2k to fund some racking for team kits.

MacGregor was also successful with a grant for \$8k from the Gambling Community Benefit Fund to rejuvenate the turf on the bowlers' runnups on each of the centre wickets and practice wickets. This work will have to wait for the end of the season because of the frequency of oval use, and not just by MacGregor members.

Russell Waugh and Ray Perry have produced a new web-site and database for MacGregor Cricket which will change the way the Club communicates with its members and how they will be able to contact the Club and access all manner of information and statistics.
